UNIVERSITY ADMISSION:

1. Submit completed Application for Admission and all credentials to the Office of Admission.
2. Submit official academic record of all work from every college attended before being advised and before an application file is considered complete to the Office of Admission.
3. A transfer student's cumulative grade point average and transferred work must meet the following conditions: **a.** Grade point average of 1.60 or above, exclusive of activity classes, when a student has attempted thirty (30) or less semester hours and completed a maximum of twelve (12) semester hours of non-activity classes. **b.** Grade point average of 1.80 or above, exclusive of activity classes, when a student has attempted thirty-one (31) to sixty (60) semester hours and completed a minimum of twelve (12) semester hours of non-activity classes. **c.** Grade point average of 2.00 or above, exclusive of activity classes, when a student has attempted over sixty (60) semester hours and completed a minimum of twelve (12) semester hours of non-activity classes.

Students may obtain a degree according to the requirements of the catalog under which he/she enters the university or under the catalog for any subsequent year in which he/she is registered, provided all requirements are completed within six years from the beginning date of the catalog chosen. Degree requirements must be completed under one catalog in effect during the student's enrollment at Howard Payne University. Students are reminded to refer to their designated catalog for information relating to the University requirements for curriculum, graduation, probation/suspension, and other general information.
